2013 Black Mountain Irrigation Project CIA Community Project in Conjunction with Green Industry Council

The CIA promotes July as Smart Irrigation Month through volunteer projects around the state. This project was done in conjunction with the GIC. The Black Mountain Home for Children was chosen as a community project for 2013.



The project included installing a centrifugal pump, controller, rain sensor, three zones of drip irrigation and a yard hydrant. The water source is a nearby mountain stream.





The Black Mountain Home for Children is a notfor-profit organization that helps provide a safe environment for children and young adults that home nowhere else to go. A section of the campus has been set aside for a community garden that provides food to local food banks and homeless shelters. The project entailed installing a three-zone drip irrigation system in this garden.
